

ROME'S ICONIC SIGHTS AND LANDMARKS



Trevi Fountain

Palazzo Colonna - Galleria Colonna

Right in the center of Rome, close to Piazza Venezia, **Palazzo Colonna** is one of the greatest Barocco Palaces of the eternal city. The impressive Colonna's Collections of paintings, sculptures and furniture from the 14th to the 18th century are unique and part of the roman history.

The Colonna Gallery is open to the public every Saturday morning from 9 am to 1,15 pm (last entrance) from Via della Pilotta 17. All other days, including Saturday afternoon, private visits by appointment.

Free guided tour (every Saturday): - in Italian at 10.00 And 11.00 Am - in French at 10.30 Am - in English at 12 am Private visits on request are available every day of the year. We also recommend a visit to the stunning Princess Isabelle Apartment with its incredible Van Wittel and Flemish Collections and the Pinturicchio frescoes.



Museo Ebraico di Roma

The **Museo Ebraico di Roma**, or the Jewish Museum of Rome, is a cultural and historical gem that resides within the complex of the Great Synagogue of Rome. This museum offers a poignant and comprehensive chronicle of the Jewish presence in Rome, which dates back more than two millennia, making it among the oldest Jewish communities in the world.

The museum's collections are a testament to the rich Jewish heritage and its enduring influence on the city's culture, featuring a wide array of artifacts, including religious textiles, ancient marble carvings, and documents that survived the devastation of World War II.

Visitors can explore the vivid tapestry of Roman Jewish life, their traditions, struggles, and contributions through interactive displays and thoughtfully curated exhibits.



Museo Leonardo Da Vinci Experience

The exhibition is one of its kind in the world, with a collection of 50 previously unseen machines, which are finally allowed to touch and try and certified reproductions of the 23 most famous paintings of the Tuscan Genius.

From The Last Supper to Mona Lisa, the recognized masterpieces have been reproduced full scale according to the typical procedures of the Renaissance workshops and using the same materials (of 500 years ago!) Leonardo used. The visit includes an audio guide too.
